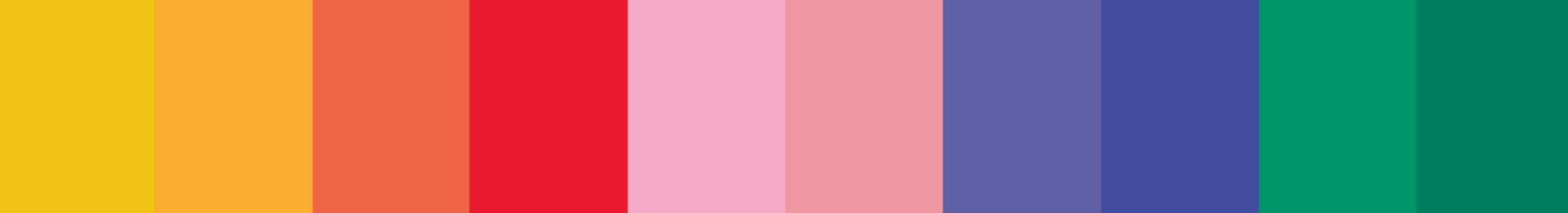

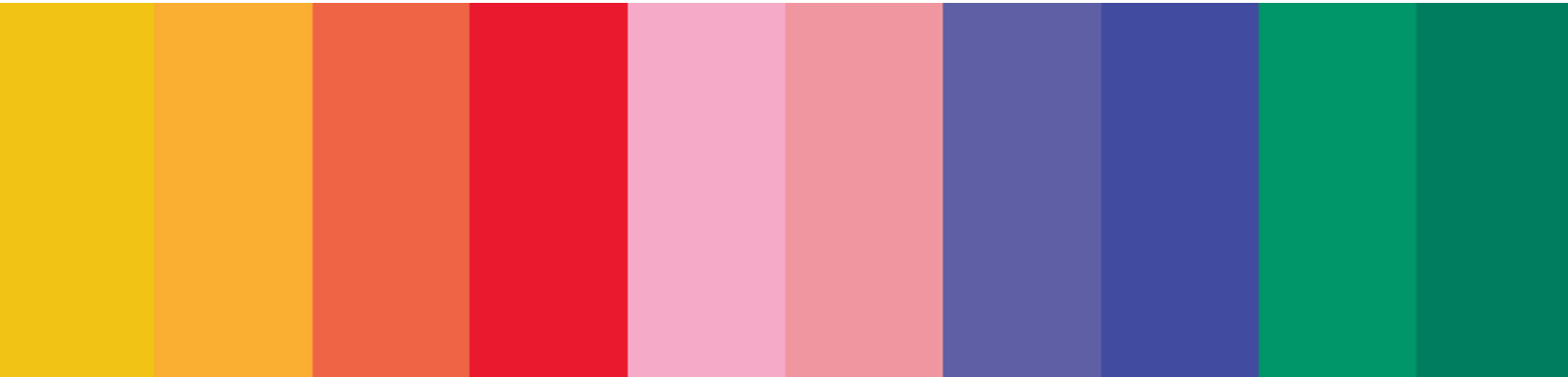
Explore how to design with intentional impact, greater responsibility and meaning by defining the emotions you want to ignite and understanding the wider ripple effects your product, service or system may create.

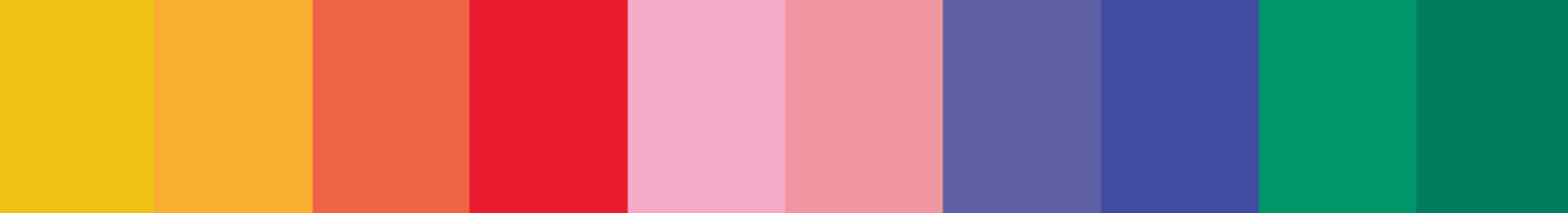
